Standing Orders



In order that the proceedings of the Convention be carried out without delay, the following Standing Orders shall be observed

- The proposer of a Motion or any agreed amendment thereto may speak for up to five minutes maximum.
- A delegate speaking to a Motion or any agreed amendment thereto may speak for up to three minutes maximum.

A maximum of two delegates from any one club shall speak on any one motion.

- The proposer of a Motion or any agreed amendment thereto may speak a second time for three minutes in advance of a vote being taken, but no other delegate may speak a second time to the same Motion or any agreed amendment thereto.
- If the Chairperson deems at any time that a Motion or any agreed amendment has been sufficiently discussed, he shall call on the Proposer for a reply after which a vote shall be taken.
- A delegate may, with the consent of the Chairperson, move “that the question be now put”, after which when the Proposer has spoken, a vote shall be taken.
- No motion shall be considered, other than that properly before the Convention.
- A suspension of Standing Orders may only be allowed with the approval of two thirds of those present, entitled to vote and voting.

The re-appointment of O' Brien & Co. as our Auditors for the coming year was agreed too on the proposal of Seán Mac Aogáin (Naomh Columba), seconded by Deiric Ó Fathaigh (Teachta do Comhairle Laighean).

ORÁID AN CATHAOIRLEACH

Éamonn Ó Raghallaigh gave his Chairpersons address to Convention as follows:

I want to welcome everybody here to our annual Convention in The Longford Arms Hotel tonight. Overall this has been a terrific year for Longford G.A.A. Most years when a Chairman begins his review of a year it starts with a review of our county teams, but given the week that is in it there is only one story that is on everybody's mind and that is the success of St. Columba's in the AIB Leinster Senior Club Football championship.

Having acquitted themselves well in the Leinster club championship in 2016 and 2017 hopes were high that St. Columba's would progress further in this year's competition. I am sure at the start their goal would have been to get the chance to make up for their disappointment of losing to St. Loman's in last year's Leinster semi-final. In order to do so they first of all had to retain the Sean Connolly Cup, which they duly did defeating a gallant Abbeylara side after a replay in The Peter Hanley Motors Senior Football Final. I said at the presentation of the Sean Connolly Cup that while everybody recognised how good a football team that St. Columba's were, the winning of the trophy for the third year in a row had established them as one of the great club teams in Longford G.A.A. history. Little did I know on that day what was to follow.

In the opening round of the Leinster club championship they had a really tough match against the Offaly champions Rhode, but the experience they had gathered over the previous two years really stood to them on the day. They really established themselves as a force to be reckoned with, by securing an emphatic win against Carlow champions Eire Óg in the semi-final. This set up what many in the media regarded as a David V Goliath scenario, with few giving St. Columba's a chance of upsetting the odds. Thankfully nobody in Mullinalaghta was listening to this, and they produced an epic performance on the day to secure the win over Dublin champions Kilmacud Crokes. The scenes that followed on match day and since will live long in the memory of not only the people of Mullinalaghta but also in the memories of all Longford Gaels at home and abroad. It was also very heart-warming to see all local rivalries being put aside with the support the team received from all the other clubs in the county on the day.

This victory epitomises everything that is great in the G.A.A. While we all acknowledge that G.A.A. is a very competitive sport and winning is important, what Mullinalaghta also have displayed is the great bond that is there between a G.A.A. club and their local community. The supporters of Mullinalaghta have to be applauded, and their pride in the team is very evident for all to see. When they lost out in the Leinster club championships in 2016 and 2017, everybody remained behind to applaud the team off the pitch, and I am sure if they had lost last Sunday they would have got the same response.

I would like to congratulate the team on their success. The players are a credit to themselves, their families, their club and the county. For any team to be successful they need a good administration behind them and I would like to thank John Keegan and Patrick Matthews and the rest of the hard working committee for all the work that they do behind the scenes. Last but by no means least, I would like to congratulate Mickey Graham and his backroom team for the huge part that they have played in the success of the team. I am sure that Mickey will see this as a work-in-progress and not the completed job and is already plotting for the match against Dr. Crokes. Best of luck to Mickey in his new role as manager of Cavan senior football team. I would like to wish the club all the best in the All-Ireland semi-final.

Above all thanks to St. Columba's for the memories so far this year and unless Longford win the Leinster Senior Football Championship it will be hard to surpass this achievement as a highlight in my tenure as Chairperson of Longford G.A.A.

Back on the county scene, hopes were high as always that Longford would have a successful year in 2018, especially with the additions of Eoin McGuire, Kevin Stritch and Kate McDaid to our backroom team. As always our season kicked off with the O'Byrne Cup, a competition where we secured qualification for the semi-final against Meath. We produced a good performance on the day but this game will probably be more remembered for the fact that it was decided by a free kick competition, the first in G.A.A. history. Our league campaign was very successful, unfortunately a few crucial refereeing decisions cost us dearly, particularly in the Armagh and Fermanagh games and despite being within a few seconds to promotion we lost out to Fermanagh in the end. Our opening round of the Leinster Championship saw us faced with a tough assignment against Meath. The one advantage we had this year was we were able to host this game in Pearse Park, and I think this factor was crucial in our victory. In the semi-final we faced a formidable Dublin side, and while Dublin did come out on top, our style of play certainly drew lots of plaudits from the viewing public. In the qualifiers we were drawn against Kildare again at home, and were in contention for long periods of this game, but Kildare eventually came out on top. Kildare went on to qualify for the Super 8's which probably shows outside the top three or four teams in the country, the margins between a lot of the remaining teams is very small.

At the end of the championship campaign Denis Connerton indicated his intention to step down from the position of manager of Longford Senior Football team. While efforts were made to see would he reconsider his position, Denis felt that the time was right after holding the position for the previous three years. I would like to thank sincerely Denis, his selectors Ciaran Fox and Enda Macken and all of the backroom team for the time and commitment they have invested in Longford G.A.A. Padraic Davis takes over the mantle from Denis and with the addition of Donal Ledwith and Paul Barden as selectors and with a strong backroom team we are hoping for a good year in 2019. The season has already commenced as we kicked off the campaign with a victory over Wicklow in the O'Byrne Cup on Saturday night last. We wish all of the management team the very best of luck for the upcoming season.

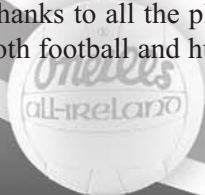
The secretary's report gives a detailed account of the performance of all our county teams in 2018 and I will just give a synopsis of their performances in the last 12 months:

Our senior hurling teams got the year off to a great start by winning The Bord na Mona Kehoe Shield for the first time. This was to be the highlight of the year. The team had a tough campaign in the Allianz National Hurling League and were unfortunately relegated to Division 3B. They did manage to retain their position in the Nicky Rackard Cup. I would like to thank Colum O'Meara and his management team who looked after the team in 2018 and I would like to wish Derek Frehill and his management team all the best for the coming season. I think promotion back to Division 3A is a realistic target for this team. Their 2019 Keogh Shield competition also started on Saturday last and despite a brave performance Longford went down to DCU in a match played in difficult conditions.

Our Longford U-20 team also had a disappointing year, but the main talking point for smaller counties has to be the timing of the competition. It does not appear likely that there is the will-power at higher level to change this decision for the coming year, and I think that this was a big factor in the decision of Liam Keenan and his management team to step down from the position. I would like to thank Liam and all of the management team for their efforts in the last twelve months. We are currently in the process of nominating a new manager for the position.

Our U-17 Longford team will look back on 2018 with a little regret but also with a great deal of pride. A below par performance in the first round against Laois cost them their chances to progress to the latter stages of the championship proper, but they made up for this disappointment by subsequently winning the Leinster Shield title beating a fancied Dublin team in the final. While the winning of this match was a great achievement, the game that stands out in my memory is the win in the semi-final against a strong Louth team in what was one of the games of the year from a Longford perspective. Last night they got their reward when they were presented with their medals by Conor McManus at a function held in Glennon Brothers Pearse Park. Thanks to Ger Carberry and his management team who were so meticulous in their preparations of this team. Unfortunately Ger is stepping down from the position of manager of the U-17 team and we will be proposing a new manager for the 2019 season at our next county board meeting.

Thanks to all the players who represented Longford on all our county teams from development squads to senior level in both football and hurling. Your dedication and the sacrifices that you make are greatly appreciated.

Back on the local scene, as I previously mentioned St. Columba's retained the Sean Connolly Cup and also added the Specsavers Division one title to their honours list. While St. Columba's are to be congratulated one has to feel sympathy for the Abbeylara team who lost their fourth final in a row. In a different era this team would probably have a number of county titles under their belts. Wolfe Tones added to their domination of the Longford Senior Hurling championship winning the title for the sixth successive time. Congratulations to Rathcline on retaining the Intermediate championship. This was a very hard fought win over a resilient St. Patrick's Ardagh/Moydow side which provided three hugely entertaining matches in the culmination of this championship. Congratulations to Emmet Óg Killoe on winning the Junior, U-20 and Minor Championships. Congratulation also to the winners of all our other championship and league competitions at both senior and under-age level.

We have already heard our financial report for the year ended 31st October, 2018. This has resulted in a turnaround in our fortunes which has resulted in a surplus of €20k as compared to a deficit of €131 k for the previous year. This was largely helped by the continued success of our annual race-day and also our inaugural Longford Lunch both of which brought in a combined profit of over €150K. We are very grateful to the hardworking committees of both events who give so generously of their time to ensure the success of these events. I would like to thank Gerry Farrell who steps down from the Dublin Race-day committee for all his hard work over the last 16 years. It was hoped to bring in another fundraising event in 2018 but this did not materialise and I think this must be a priority for our finance committee in early 2019 to maintain our financial stability. Another good boost to our coffers was the half-time draws, and I would like to thank the members of our 20/20 Workgroup and all ticket sellers for giving so much of their time to make these draws a success. Glennon Brothers continue to be our main sponsor for all our county teams and I would like to thank them again along with all the sponsors of all our championships, leagues, Race-day, the Longford Lunch, Golf Classic, bursaries and those who give generous donations during the year.

During the year there have been a number of high profile incidents of indiscipline at National level. While even one incident is unacceptable I think the number of these incidents is decreasing in comparison to the number of games that is being played nationally, which is a welcome trend. Our CCCC continue to be a very busy committee but thankfully there have been few incidents of indiscipline during the year. I did highlight last year that the majority of incidents that were occurring were at under-age-level and do not involve players but often supporters and mentors of teams. Another worrying trend that cropped up during the year was racial abuse of players and also under-age players being targeted for abuse on social media. While it is impossible for clubs to monitor all the various platforms that are available to every player they should at least educate their players that such abuse is not acceptable at any level. While some senior clubs are good at taking charge of their under-age affairs some clubs adopt the attitude that it should be handed over to a number of individuals, let them do their fundraising, operate their own bank accounts which is not the model of how an under-age club should be run. Minor 'clubs' are sub-committees of the senior club and they should take responsibility for same. It was interesting at a recent review of under-age competitions in the county, where representatives of the senior committees and minor sub-committees of all clubs were invited to attend that there were only 5 of the senior committees represented.

Part of the minor competition review involved a discussion on odd versus even ages for under-age competitions. I think it is now time to grab the bull by the horns and move to the odd ages. When this proposal was mooted last year, I predicted that maintaining the current structures would lead to long intervals where players were not getting any football and I think this proved to be the case. I appreciate that people have concerns about the gap from U-17 to U-20 and the threat of losing players to other codes but I think if we maintain meaningful U-18 competition as well as the odd ages we can overcome this concern. Our competition structures at under-age level may not be perfect but the standard in some of our under-age finals this year was exceptional.

Last year I advocated for the setting up of a meaningful second tier competition in the All-Ireland Football series. Thankfully there has been some progress made in this area. I believe that the proposal has to appeal to the weaker counties. Currently a county team has two chances at the All-Ireland Series, in that if they are knocked out of the provincial, championship they then proceed to the qualifiers. I note that some proposals want a situation where a Division 3 or 4 team is knocked out of their provincial championship that they will then enter a second tier competition. The only way that any proposal will work is whereby you continue to give teams two chances in the All-Ireland series before they go into a second tier competition, otherwise it will not be accepted by a lot of counties. I still am a firm believer that if the imbalance in the provincial structures was addressed it would solve a lot of problems between club and county fixtures.

Every year over the last number of years a constant theme in the Chairman's address has been the issue of Pearse Park. Thankfully this work commenced in 2018 and will be completed early in 2019. This work would not have been possible without the financial support we received from Croke Park and Leinster Council and I want to publicly acknowledge that support here tonight. I would like to thank David Blessington and his staff, Don Toomey and the staff of Malachy Walsh & Partners and Frank Murray on behalf of Croke Park for the professional manner in which they have handled the project. This contract at times during the year required daily monitoring and I would like to thank Peter O'Reilly for co-ordinating between all these parties as the works were being progressed.

Clubs also received a financial boost during the year with the announcement that J.P. McManus was donating €100,000 to every county board in the country for distribution to its clubs. While some people tried to detract from this donation, I am sure it was a welcome boost to every club in the country and on behalf of the clubs in Co. Longford I would like to thank J.P. & Noreen McManus and their family for the generous donation.

National titles are not easy come by at any level. It was great to see the John West Féile na nGael competitions come to the Longford Slashers and Wolfe Tones clubs. Both clubs embraced this enthusiastically and it was a proud day for the Longford Slashers club when they won All-Ireland title at both hurling and camogie. This was quickly followed by success for the Granard/Ballymore amalgamation who were equally successful in the football competition – Féile Peil na nÓg. Congratulations to all concerned. Congratulations to Johnny Casey on his All-Star Award and also on representing Ireland in the annual Shinty competition.

I would like to thank all the members of the Executive for their tireless work in 2018. They give their time voluntarily and spend many hours, a lot of it unseen in working for the Association in Longford. Tonight sees Mícheál Carrigy step down as Central Council representative having completing his 5 year term. Mícheál has been a great servant to Longford G.A.A. in a number of different roles over many years. We hope that he will continue with us in some capacity into the future. Thanks to all to the members of our various sub-committees for their contribution in the last twelve months.

Thankfully my job is made a lot easier by the staff we have employed in the offices in Pearse Park. The workload that is involved in being a county secretary is constantly increasing but I would like to thank Peter for the professional and efficient manner in which he carries out his duties. He is ably assisted in the office by people who have a great interest in Longford G.A.A. and I would like to thank personally Lorraine who is badly missed from the office at present, Damien, Paddy and Eoin for their work with Coaching & Games and our development squads and to our most recent addition Seamus Hughes for the great work he is doing with hurling at the moment.

Thanks to the sports staff at ShannonSide Radio, the journalists in the Longford Leader for their continued coverage of Longford GAA affairs. The great thing about the personnel involved is not only are they good journalist but are all avid Longford GAA. supporters. Thanks to our referees, umpires, CE Scheme staff, gate people, stewards, people who help in the kitchen and everybody who helped us in any way during the year. I would also like to thank all the clubs and their delegates for the courtesy they have shown me in the last year.

In 2018 as in every other year we lost some people who had given great service to the GAA in Longford and some of our members lost loved ones over the past 12 months. I do not intend to mention them all individually but the whole GAA community was shocked by the tragic death of Danny McGee. To the McGee family and all the families who suffered bereavements in 2018 I extend my heartfelt sympathy.

I would like to thank Orlagh Reynolds and the staff here at The Longford Arms Hotel for hosting our Convention. I would also like to express my sympathy to the Reynolds family on the untimely passing of John Reynolds.

Thanks to Carmel, my family and close friends who keep me grounded and provide me with the support when things are not going to plan.

I would like to take this opportunity to wish you, your families, your club members and their families a very Merry Christmas and a prosperous New Year.

ELECTION / APPOINTMENT OF OFFICERS, REPRESENTATIVES & DELEGATES

The meeting on the proposal of Nollaig Ó Buail (Baile Móir), seconded by Tomás Hawes (Clairseoirí Maigh Dhuibh) agreed to appoint the following tellers – Colum Ó Muirí and Éamonn Ó Braonáin representing Coiste Bainistí together with Mícheál Mac Lámha (Grattan Óg) and Seán Mac Giolla Mheana (Baile Móir).

The Rúnaí advised Delegates that the PR system would operate for the election of Officers and Representatives and that “first past the post” would operate for the election of Delegates to Leinster Convention and Congress.

The voting strength of the meeting was, following a roll call, determined as 80.

The following officers being the outgoing position holders and sole nominee for each position and having been duly proposed by Seán Mac Aogáin (Naomh Columba) and seconded by Antaine Mac Tiarnáin (Naomh Bríd Cill na Síde) were elected unopposed:

Cathaoirleach –Éamonn Ó Raghallaigh

Leas Cathaoirleach – Bríd Ní Gualraic

Cisteoir – Ailbhe Ó Cuana

Leas Cisteoir – Eoghan Ó Cuaine

Oifigeach Pleanála & Forbartha an Chontae – Colum Ó Muirí

Oifigeach Teanga an Gaeilge & Cultúir – Éamonn Ó Bhreanáin

Oifigeach Oiliúna & Forbartha na gCluichí – Fionnbharr Ó Miacháin

Oifigeach Caidreamh Poiblí – Tomás Mac Lochlainn

Teachta do Árd Chomhairle – As Mícheál Mac Concharraige 5 year term had expired a vote was taken between Gearóid Ó hÁgáin (proposed by Briain Ó Donnchú (Emmet Óg), seconded by Seán Ó Dúda (Emmet Óg)).

Eoin Ó Muireartaigh (proposed by Proinsias Mag Raghnaill (Seán Ó Conghaile), seconded by Mícheál Ó Dughaill (Clairseoirí Maigh Dhuibh)). G. Ó hÁgáin was declared the winner following a secret ballot on a count of 48 as against 31 for E. Ó Muireartaigh with 1 spoilt vote.

Teachtaí Do Comhairle Laighean – Deiric Ó Fathaigh being the sole nominee was deemed elected unopposed.

As there remained a vacant position, the Cathaoirleach advised Convention that the process of electing a second representative on Provincial Council would be determined by Coiste Chontae at its first meeting of the New Year.

Teachtaí Do Chomhdháil Laighean (2) – As Seán Ó hAnnáin and Eoin Ó Muireartaigh were the only nominees they were deemed elected along with the Cathaoirleach and Rúnaí.

Teachtaí Do Chomhdháil Bhliantúil (2) – Following a vote Séamas Mac Ruairí (59) and Eoin Ó Muireachtaigh (57) were elected to attend along with the Cathaoirleach and Rúnaí. S. Ó hAnnáin (42) was the defeated candidate.

Children’s Officer & Development Officer - The meeting also ratified the appointment of Máire Ní Raghallaigh Cianáin as Children’s Officer and Colum Ó Muirí as Development Officer, both of whom had been nominated by the outgoing Coiste Chontae.

G. Ó hÁgáin spoke following his election. Mícheál Ó Concharraige (outgoing) and Eoin Ó Muireartaigh also spoke.

The Cathaoirleach spoke on behalf of all other re-elected / appointed Officers.

GUEST SPEAKER:

Whilst the votes were being counted Eddie Ward (HSE Resource Officer) gave a very informative presentation to the meeting in regard to mental health and suicide related issues.

MOTIONS:

The motions as per the Convention Book were dealt with as indicated below;

Motion 1 on behalf of Coiste Chontae was proposed by Antaine Ó Dúnabhra and seconded by Louis Ó Sceallaigh. The Rúnaí explained the reasons for the motion. Following this Páraic Ó Cathaíl (Carraig Éamonn) stated that this and a number of other motions were not in order as they had not been brought to Convention in accordance with rule. This was seconded by Eoin Ó Muireachtaigh. The Cathaoirleach then ruled the Motion out along with Motions 2 & 3 and following comment by the Rúnaí also ruled out Motion 4

Motion 5 on behalf of Mainistir Leathrátha - was proposed by Bearnard Ó Giollagáin and seconded by Mícheál Ó Dughaill. Páraic Ó Cathaíl stated that this motion was not Convention business. The Cathaoirleach was not in agreement and opened the motion for debate. A number of contributions were made in opposition to the motion. The proposer in his right of reply withdrew the motion.

As a result Motions 5A & 5B were not dealt with.

That concluded the motions. Both Mainistir Leathrátha and Naomh Mhuire Granárd had forwarded motions which were deemed not to be Convention business. The Cathaoirleach invited a Delegate from each Club to outline the basis of each motion, which both did and these were referred to a meeting of Coiste Chontae in the New Year.

There being no further business, the Cathaoirleach wished all present a Happy Christmas Convention ended with a prayer for all those present, their Families and Gaels throughout Longford who had suffered bereavements during the past year.

County Scene

It would be hard to follow on from the success of Mullinalaghta St. Columba's in winning the AIB Leinster Club Football final on the first Sunday of December 2019. When the dust settled, they began preparing for an All-Ireland semi-final encounter against Dr. Crokes which was played in Semple Stadium in mid-February. Great support travelled from every parish of the county and beyond in support of this team. Unfortunately, defeat was to be their lot but all present acknowledged their achievement and were proud of their efforts. Their success made for a short winter!

Our senior hurlers were one of two teams to bring home silverware (Division 3B Cup) this season, the other being our U17's who retained the Leinster Minor Shield.

Senior Hurling: Going into 2019 our hurlers under new management had set themselves two targets, both of which they achieved – promotion from Division 3B and holding their status in the Nicky Rackard Cup. With a bye in the first round and having won their subsequent three games, they had reached the league final with a game to spare. Sligo were our opponents in the final round whom we played with an experimental team a week in advance of the playing the same opposition in the final at a very wintery Connacht GAA Centre at Began. This game ebbed and flowed with Longford coming out on top with 2 points to spare after extra time.

After losing by three points in the opening round of the Nicky Rackard Cup V Warwickshire, we needed a win against Monaghan to hold our status and this we did. As the final game progressed, Armagh grew in stature and were comfortable winners.

There was to be no back to back success in the Kehoe Shield following two losses to DCU St. Patrick's Campus and Louth (both by four points). Leinster have, in my opinion, made a wise decision to retire this competition for 2020 and now both ourselves and Louth have entered the Conor McGurk competition in Ulster.

Thanks to the playing panel, the management team and the backroom personnel for all their efforts over the season.

Congrats to David Buckley on his Champion 15 nomination for his displays in the Nicky Rackard Cup.

Senior Football: Longford's new year commenced in December with the Bord na Mona O' Byrne Cup under a new Management team and many new panel members given, in part, that our Leinster Club heroes were preparing for an AIB Club All-Ireland Semi Final. Single point victories were secured over Wicklow and Meath respectively followed by a draw with Louth in this the first outing of 2019. We exited this competition following defeat to Westmeath in the semi-final.

Going into the 2019 Allianz League Division 3, we harboured hopes of promotion. We got off to a great start with two wins and a draw from the opening 3 rounds but then hit a poor patch which saw us lose to both Down and Laois. A comfortable win over Sligo followed by defeat to the eventual Division 3 league winners Westmeath saw us finish mid table. We should have got something from the Laois game which could have left us with a very intriguing game in the final round V Westmeath but all in all this was a very respectable showing. Credit to the newcomers who weren't fazed when thrown in at the deep end and proved the ability there is in Longford Club football.

The Leinster Championship saw us pitted against Kildare in round 1 in Tullamore. Following an extremely competitive and engrossing game which resulted in a forty score draw both teams were back in Tullamore the following weekend where we didn't get going and Kildare won with ease.

We had a comfortable win away to Carlow in the opening round of the Qualifiers and then faced Tyrone in Glennon Brothers Pearse Park. Tyrone, true to form, brought great support and we also got an opportunity to show off the revamped Park, the works on which at that point were almost complete. As the saying goes "goals win games" and we gifted two in the first half which left us playing catch up to the end in a four-point defeat. Tyrone went on to reach the All-Ireland semi-final where Kerry beat them by three.

Junior Football: As mentioned in last year's report the positioning of this competition amongst a congested inter county calendar means it does not serve a purpose for Longford. Thankfully, with U20 reverting to the Springtime come 2020, it will once again allow us develop players for the future.

In 2019 this team was under the wing of our senior management and they saw off the challenge of Carlow in the first round but succumbed to Kildare in the semi-final – the big talking point being the exhibition given by Kildare's Johnny Doyle at the tender age of 41.

U20 Football: In my report last year, I wrote of the downside to the restructuring of this competition (timing, developmental status, no challenge games, no Hastings Cup etc.). As a part fix a league competition was introduced which gave us games in the build-up to the championship against Leitrim, Sligo and Fermanagh for the Philly McGuinness Cup. We beat Leitrim and lost the remaining two games by two points each.

It was now onto championship where we received the poisoned chalice in this year's opening round draw of the Leinster Championship in that we drew Dublin who would go on to contest the All-Ireland Final at this grade. Committed as they were, this step up in class was a step too far for our lads. Thanks to each and everyone of the players for pulling on the jersey. A special word of thanks to Paul McGuire who along with his backroom team took on a most difficult task without hesitation given that the Leinster draw was known in advance of his appointment.

On the eve of Special Congress last October, Central Council agreed through a deviation to rule to move this competition to the Springtime – a move that is most welcome. Donal Ledwith (senior selector) has taken over as manager of this squad for 2020 and it is hoped that in the long term this will aid the quicker transition of players from this grade to the ranks of the seniors. Competition wise we have got a lot of things changed but we can't get away from a possible opening fixture v Dublin!

U17 Football: Dan McElligott and Barry O'Rourke took over this group of players for 2019. Having prepared very well in the run up to the opening round of the Leinster Championship, expectations were high, but all came a cropper in the Westmeath game. We just didn't perform and yet we had enough chances to win any game but ultimately defeat was to be our lot. We dusted ourselves down and got the win against Carlow but fell to Laois in the final round stage game with a two-point margin either way in each game.

We were now into the Shield competition and had wins over Offaly and Louth before beating Wexford in the final played at Portlaoise to lift the Seamus Heaney Cup for the second year in succession. A very enjoyable presentation night took place in St. Mel's College recently where the panel received their medals from Jim Bolger, Cathaoirleach Comhairle Laighean CLG.

My thanks to all players, their parents, the management and backroom personnel for their dedication throughout the year.

Best wishes to Brian Noonan and Vinny Nally who have been nominated for appointment by Coiste Chontae as joint managers for 2020 along with selectors John Dempsey and Ciarán Garvey.

Club Scene

There were no real surprises from the round stages of the senior championship, but the knockout stages had no time for favourites or tradition. Mullinalaghta St. Columba's, our county champions of three years fell at quarter final stage to Colmcille who in turn fell to the ultimate champions Killoe Young Emmets. On the other side Abbeylara who were beaten in the final on four previous occasions lost out on another final place by the narrowest of margins to Longford Slashers who had not featured in conversation in the pre championship build up.

Garrycastle of Westmeath were just too strong on the day when they met Killoe Young Emmet's in the opening round of this year's Leinster Club competition.

Mullinalaghta did retain the Division 1 Johnny Skelly Cup and also had success in winning the Leader Cup final versus Colmcille.

With Rathcline now senior having won the Gerry Hennessy Cup in two successive years and Ballymahon taking the decision to move back a grade, all eyes were set on new champions at Intermediate level. Indeed, Ballymahon's decision proved a wise one when they reached the final after a replayed semi-final versus Ardagh Moydow who would have been seen as having a great chance considering St. Patrick's Ardagh's exploits the previous year and following their amalgamation with Moydow Harpers earlier in 2019. At the end of a very enjoyable championship it was Fr. Manning Gaels who came out on top.

The Gaels went on to overcome O'Hanrahan's of Carlow in the Leinster competition only to lose out to Rosenallis in the quarter finals.

St. Mary's Granard won the Division 2 (Michael Moran Cup) and the Patsy Reilly Cup (division 2 top 4) along with the John Drake Cup.

Following much discussion at County Committee level over a number of meetings including one which I did not properly notify, Kenagh accepted the decision that they play Junior Championship in accordance with our regulations. They knuckled down and got just reward for all their work by beating Killoe Young Emmet's by a point and thus winning the Junior Championship – a long awaited but merited success.

For the first time in many year's our Junior Champions represented us in the AIB Club Leinster Junior Championship – a change from previously whereby the Intermediate runners-up partook. Kenagh had success over Berlin in the opening round on a tough weekend on the McGann Family to whom I offer my sympathies. However, they faltered against Ballymore Eustace of Kildare at the quarter final stage.

Killoe Young Emmets were Division 3 league winners with Colmcille winning the Gilmore Cup.

The U20 Championship title went to Killoe Young Emmets, with the U20 Cup going to a young Northern Gaels side who beat a gallant Rathcline side by the minimum.

Longford Slashers by the minimum over St. Colmcille's / St. Francis in a great Minor Championship Final took home the Harte Cup with Northern Gaels winning the 'B' and St. Francis taking the honours in the 'C' competition.

The one remaining match to be played is the Juvenile Championship Final which is on hold pending the outcome of an investigation into certain alleged issues that arose following a game played in this competition in early September. Suffice to say that what most of the county now knows to be the truth cannot be put in writing at this juncture. Hopefully, whatever arises from this investigation will bring finality to this matter.

St. Colmcille's won the 'B' Cup and Southern Gaels won the 'C' Cup at this grade.

Clonguish Óg have a very promising team at U14 level and took home all the honours within Longford – Féile, U14 Championship (Paddy Doris Cup) & league. They also had huge success at national Féile where they won a national title – congrats to all players and mentors.

Carrick Sarsfields won the 'B' Cup and St. Francis won the 'C' Cup at this grade.

Our Cross Border U12 competition with the clubs of Leitrim was once again hugely successful with all underage sections in Longford participating. This success is due in no small way to the efforts of our own Damien Sheridan and Thomas Keenan (GM in Leitrim).



Congratulations to all the winners of 2019 and thanks to all the participating teams, their mentors and Clubs without whom there would be no winners.

On the hurling front Clonguish Gaels won the championship after many years without success and went on to beat Barnarrig of Wicklow and Mountmellick of Laois before losing out in the semi-final to the now Leinster Junior Champions, Conahy Shamrocks of Kilkenny.

Despite the work and resources being put into underage hurling by our fulltime coach, Seamus only one (U16) underage championship final was played with victory going to Longford Slashers. The U14 and Minor finals were conceded and the U20 final has been fixed on two occasions and subsequently pulled. This does not auger well for our national game into the future. Given that both clubs are in urban areas and make use of the deviation rule, numbers are not the reason. Has the win at all cost mentality rather than participation become a factor?

Thanks to our neighbouring counties who over many years have facilitated our hurling sections with entry to their competitions. On the national scene, I am glad to see that the Táin league is finally ready to go and with the right buy in hurling will prosper.

The club results for the past year are to be found elsewhere in this Convention Book.

Other

In writing my annual report of any given year, I usually do a scan of the minutes of County Committee meetings and Management meetings to jolt my memory of the happenings over the past 12 months. This year was no different. Strangely, what I came across was what was absent or there only in a minimum manner. Let me explain further, between both Committees almost 30 meetings were held and in many cases none or minimum mention was made of what is or should be at the end of the day our core business – the promotion of Gaelic Games through player and club development.

As you are aware Longford GAA has been firefighting various issues continuously since last year's Convention, one of which ended with a successful decision from the DRA; resignations have been received; investigations have been held – the list goes on.

Why was this? It seems as if the promotion of our Association is no longer high on some people's agenda's – over the Summer with issues ongoing or arising in quick succession, one person put it as follows "it's all a bit of craic". The number of hours wasted on these matters which should have been put towards an improved service to all clubs is staggering. With a New Year on the horizon, a new start needs to be the main agenda item going forward. You – the Clubs, are the ones best placed to drive this agenda.

Underage Review and Age Grades: The recent issuing of the Central Council policy directive on age grades has taken all the headlines and caused heated discussion in recent times – I can't actually see why, given that its purpose was to give direction as requested by counties who are working towards facilitating proper fixtures planning and to facilitate those counties who commence competitions early each year, all ahead of bringing a motion to Congress. From the Longford seminar on Tuesday week last, attended by representatives of all underage sections, along with the information gathered by our survey it looks to me that this change facilitates a proper underage fixtures program through Cross Border competition involving Leitrim and with the introduction of an U13 and U19 competition(s) it will help curtail drop off which has been a scourge, especially in rural clubs come the end of the Primary and Post Primary curriculum. Are we really satisfied with a premier league that gives you just two games and a possible final?

Games Program: Just as shown at underage competition level there also exists serious issues at adult level and in particular the Reserve Leagues where the rate of walkovers is very high. These leagues should in the main be catering for two types namely the player just out of underage looking to break into adult and secondly the social footballer. Because of the level of walkovers neither player is getting a consistent run of games and this inevitably leads to drop out. Can we rectify this? Of course, we can. We urgently need a review that looks for a long-term fix not a short-term gain. I have previously mentioned the "Monaghan option" as a solution which I accept may not cure all our ills, but I am sure of one thing, that the present system is not fit for purpose.



Tier 2 Championship: This has become a reality at Special Congress in October and will come into being next year. Longford, after much debate were fully in favour of the Second Tier concept but not the format as proposed and therefore decided to vote against it. One big negative that arises is the time between being knocked out of the Provincial Championship and the commencement of Tier 2 – six weeks which brings with it additional team preparation costs etc. I'm sure that the report of the Fixtures Calendar Review Task Force (which is due in the coming days) will propose a more workable model.

Glennon Brothers Pearse Park: This project as set out originally is complete with the exception of snagging and has come in on budget of ?2.65m thanks to the diligent work of our Project Manager, Frank Murray. Thanks also to our financiers – Croke Park and Leinster Council, our engineer Don Twomey and our main contractor David Blessington.

Fundraising & Sponsorship: On viewing our annual accounts, the importance of our fundraising efforts becomes very clear. Our Race Day remains our number one but is not sufficient on its own and as I have stated on a number of occasions the necessity to secure something else which will help build up our reserves again given their depletion due to the revamp of Pearse Park is a must. Thankfully, tonight will see the launch of that project - Club Longford. As the saying goes “a lot done, more to do” but I have no doubt that under the chair of Mark Connellan this enthusiastic group of Longford men and women will help swell the coffers.

The half time draws / shop and golf classic also help raise significant funds which help deliver many programs to our Development Squad members such as grinds and career guidance. The other major work of the 20/20 workgroup sees seven bursaries being given to third level students who are ineligible for bursaries from any other source. This sponsorship by Bord na Mona, Supermacs, Longford Signs, Panelto and others who wish to remain anonymous is invaluable and I believe it is a vote of confidence in the members of this workgroup and the work they are doing in a very unassuming manner in promoting the well-being of our youth.

Referees: In cooperation with our Referees Committee, the 20/20 workgroup this year funded heart screening for all referees. I can confirm that all referees, despite the loud utterances of a minority of officials / supporters were found to have a heart. I say this, not to be smart, but to enforce the point that referees are human, make mistakes on occasion, have feelings and also have families who on occasion travel to games with them and hear people shout obscenities at their loved ones as if that is what they are there for. A new departure for 2019 is, what I would call, the bullying of referees who are coming off the pitch, making their way to the dressing rooms or subsequently. What message is this sending out to our youth as they watch a team mentor / a parent, or a neighbour engage in such practices? Have Clubs forgot about the “Give Respect, Get Respect” initiative too?

The continual shortage of referees especially over the past year has led on occasions to the cancellation of a number of underage games. This is very unfortunate, especially on our youth whom we are trying to hold within the Association, however it is inevitable that this situation will become more commonplace as we collectively do nothing to address the situation.

Allianz League Division 3B Final

Longford 2-15 Sligo 3-10 (AET)

After almost letting the victory slip from their grasp with Sligo scoring three goals in the second half, resolute Longford eventually won the National Hurling League Division 3B title after extra-time at the Connacht GAA Centre, Began, Co Mayo.

Played in extremely difficult weather conditions on a bitterly cold day, Longford were the better team throughout this tough Final. Inspired by a brilliant individual goal from impressive midfielder David Buckley in the 24th minute of the first half, Longford were full value for their 1-5 to 0-4 lead at the break. 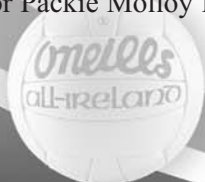

**A last gasp fisted point from Ronan McGoldrick in the fourth minute of stoppage time won the Senior Football Championship title for Killoe in a dramatic finish to the County Final**

Mark Hughes got the first score in the final with six minutes gone on the clock when he fisted the ball over the bar while Slashers opened their account a couple of minutes later when Andrew Kelly fired over a free. Clarke was on target from play when he blasted the ball over the bar in the 21st minute. I had the honour of being elected Cisteoir Longfort at convention 2014 and the intervening years appear to have whizzed by with plenty of action on and off the pitch. When I commenced my role, the stands at Pearse Park had just been declared unfit for purpose and would be unavailable for use for the following 4 years. This was a big blow for the Longford GAA community, but after much discussion and debate around the best possible solutions, David Blessington Concrete Works together with Malachy Walsh & Partners were appointed as main contractors and consulting engineers respectively, culminating in a fine football stadium being ready for use this past summer. We now have the best GAA stadium in the midland's c/w ease of parking, access and comfortable viewing facilities. Well done to everybody involved and many thanks for the patience and understanding demonstrated by our loyal supporters.

Accounts for the year ended Oct. 2019, show total income of ?1,538,135 and expenditure of ?1,407,882 representing a loss of ?130,000. Main reasons for such a loss are a reduced income of just over ?70,000 and increased expenditure of ?80,000.

The annual Longford Lunch organised by our sponsors Glennon Brothers did not take place this year and this would account for the main reason of a reduction of income as it created an income of ?80,000 the previous year. It is planned that this event will take place in Spring 2020.

Expenditure increase mainly to due to extra spend on catering, medical, and sports gear for all of our football teams which accounts for ?58,000 approx. Other areas of increased expenditure are pitch maintenance, security and referees' expenses.

As we had estimated at the beginning of the year that we needed an additional annual income of about ?150,000 to meet annual budget requirements, I set about organising a fundraising committee which has culminated in the foundation of Club Longford, chaired by local GAA stalwart, Mark Connellan and assisted by secretary, Thomas Conefrey from Dromard, together with eight other committee members. Target for Club Longford is to raise a minimum of ?150,000 annually and as time progresses to increase revenue further, thus eliminating lost revenue in the coming years and strengthening the position of Longford football on the national stage.

Club Longford hope that it will also increase the profile of Longford GAA and help to create awareness and excitement around our football teams.

As I complete my term of five years, I wish to thank our main sponsors Glennon Brothers for the never-ending support they have provided, through sponsorship and Longford Lunch event, and their active participation within team structures.

Many thanks to former chairman Eamon Reilly, secretary Peter O'Reilly and all members of Executive for their support throughout the last five years.

Special word of thanks to Eugene Quaine, Asst. Treasurer, for his work ethic and unending support throughout, the team of gate collectors - about 26 in total for their excellent commitment and diplomacy in dealing with our customers and without whom games could not take place.

Finally, to my wife Carolyn, Gavan and Carol for their support, patience and understanding for the last 5 years, I say thank you very much.

2019 has seen a number of clubs make significant progress with their development plans and club facilities in Longford are fast becoming the envy of others around the country.

A large number of Longford clubs were successful applicants to the Sports Capital Programme in 2018 and 2019 and this money is being put to excellent use with 4 clubs currently or in the early stages of clubhouse redevelopment, 2 others nearing the completion of community walkways at their facility and numerous other clubs carrying out essential maintenance and improvement works. In 2019 GAA clubs in the county were successful in applying for funding through the Community Enhancement Programme and with last year's changes of local LEADER funding policy, Longford clubs have been successful in drawing down circa €900,000 from this programme already. In January, as with 2019, a list of avenues for clubs to avail of potential funding will be compiled and circulated in order to make sure that as an organisation, we are aware of what funding is available to us and in a position to be awarded our share of the pie.

As with the past number of years, the GAA's insurance premium continues to rise and a lot of this increase is attributed to personal injury claims against the GAA. It is of the utmost importance that clubs inspect their grounds for potential hazards and rectify the issues. Prevention is the name of the game in tackling these claims. Health and Safety Inspections were carried out at random by members of the Leinster Infrastructure Committee in Longford club grounds this year and whilst all clubs passed the test, some small issues were identified in virtually all of the grounds. As there will be further inspections in 2020, I will organise to carry out preliminary checks throughout the county early in the New Year.

As with every year of my tenure as Development Officer, I have attempted to keep the subject of a state-of-the-art training facility to the fore in my endeavours. Unfortunately, for various reasons, little progress was made on the matter in 2019. Club facilities remain under increased pressure each year to facilitate our county teams. It is imperative that this subject is placed at the forefront of the considerations of Coiste Bainisti for 2020. If our long term goal is to catch and match the best in Leinster, then providing the correct facilities for our development squads and County Teams has to be part of the plan.

In April, a very successful training evening was held in St. Mel's College for club Chairpersons, Secretaries and Treasurers on the subject of Club Governance. The event was very well attended by clubs. I wish to thank Emmet Haughian and his team from Croke Park and Peter O'Reilly, Brid McGoldrick and Declan Rowley for their help in organising the event.

2018 saw roughly 70 volunteers from across the county complete a stewarding course and numbers attending at games in Pearse Park that year were very encouraging. However, 2019 saw a falloff in these numbers and whilst the year went off without major incident, the number of stewards currently making themselves available, not weekly but every once in a while, will not be sufficient to meet requirements on match days. A new course for stewards will be organised in 2020. The training these stewards receive can be carried back to clubs to ensure the smooth running of games around club grounds throughout the year, so it will be beneficial to clubs to identify as many people as possible to attend.

## Coiste Riarachán na Réiteoirí

Firstly, thanks to our 28 referees who facilitated the playing of 717 games in 2019.

There are 28 referees active and to comfortably cover all games and not have referees having to referee more than one game on a given day, there needs to be at least 45 available. We must compliment the referees for giving so much of their time.

Thanks to all the umpires who gave of their time to stand at the posts for our referees - your job is invaluable and we really appreciate it.

### Referee Survey

Two anonymous surveys were conducted with current and former referees. 22 current referees replied & 25 former referees replied.

#### Current Referees:

The main reasons reported by referees on why they commenced refereeing and continued to do so was to stay fit and to stay involved in the game. Current referees identified the following areas for improvement:

- A greater level of respect to be shown to them
- Continuation of the mentoring program
- Better recognition for their umpires

Some of the reasons that will impact on their continued involvement:

- Not enough support from the GAA nationally
- Late notice of games
- Appointment process of referees to games (lack of fairness and transparency)

#### Former Referees:

Their main reasons for dropping out were a lack of support and other work/life commitments (still playing with a team). On an encouraging note a lot of these referees said that they would consider coming back to refereeing if sufficient supports were in place and if there was a revised training program and a fairer appointments process. Finally, 17 of the 25 (68 per cent) reported that they would consider umpiring or doing linesperson going forward. This is to be welcomed.

### Referees Forum

A Referee forum was set up to enable referees bring areas of address to the Referees Administrator, Joe O'Brien and the County Executive. From these discussions an action plan is being implemented to address both the survey findings as well as matters raised at meetings.

## **Actions Completed:**

- A cardiac screening day was provided free to all referees (18 availed of this)
- Referee Specific group was set up to represent referees. This group report to the referee steering committee and fosters improved levels of communication between referees and county officials
- A review of the match fees was conducted
- A pilot program is in development to train and develop transition year students from January - May 2020 while in School and to extend this program through the summer for those who display an interest and an aptitude to progress. This program will be funded by the fundraising completed by 20/20 Committee. St. Mel's College has kindly agreed to pilot this program.
- A system of borrowing wet gear was put in place for lines people at championship games

## **Actions Going Forward:**

- Follow up with respondents from former referees' group and talk to those who might be willing to return to refereeing
- Follow up with the former referee's and provide courses for those who want to umpire or be a linesperson
- Train up more persons in order to provide referees with regular assessments
- Provision of waterproof wetsuit for use during inclement weather, both when refereeing and acting as linesman.
- Following implementation of actions outlined to resurvey group to see if actions taken have improved satisfaction

## **Recruitment of new referees:**

Recruitment continues to be difficult in Longford as in other counties. In 2019, we had resignation of referees. We would hope with the positive feedback from improvements made and further plans for referees that these referees will reconsider their decisions and return to refereeing. It is also time for clubs to make a genuine effort to help recruit members who are willing to take up the whistle

## **Resignation of Referee Coordinator:**

Joe O'Brien resigned as Referees Administrator in September. We wish to thank Joe sincerely for his service to Longford GAA over many years. Joe is an honest, dedicated volunteer and is sadly missed by those who had the pleasure to work with him.

## **Referees on the National Stage:**

Two of our referees continue to enhance their reputations on the inter-county circuit namely Fergal Kelly and Patrick Maguire. Indeed, Patrick handled last weekend's AIB Leinster Club Intermediate Football Final. We wish both of them and their team of umpires continued success.

## Underage review:

A request was made for an Underage Fixtures Review to be carried out. A work group including Finbarr Meehan, Eamon Reilly, (replaced by Bríd McGoldrick), Tommy McLoughlin, Peter O'Reilly, Michael Lynch, Mick Hand & Damien Sheridan was formed. The group decided on the use of a number of different surveys to get as much input from stakeholders as possible. The surveys were circulated to 4 groups in midOctober namely Underage Coaches, Underage Players, and Officers of club underage sections and Referees. In all there were 216 surveys completed which was a huge sample size to work with. Huge work was put into compiling the responses in text and graph form and a 105 page document was provided to all clubs containing all the information gathered. On November 19th there was a presentation made on the findings of the surveys to a Coiste na nÓg meeting. During this meeting there was evidence of good engagement and follow up meeting was scheduled for December 3rd. The purpose of this meeting was to develop a plan for underage structure for 2020.

## Fundraising:

We held our very successful golf classic on 12 October 2019. We also opened a shop in Glennon Brothers Pearse Park and with continued success of Half time draws will now be in a position to give a grant to the hurling committee (for use for players on County panel who are completing state exams) as well as maintaining the provision of careers guidance and nutrition training. Due to our fundraising success we will be in a position to support a pilot programme for training and development of young referees. This program is detailed in the referee report elsewhere in this booklet. Thanks to our tutors who provided excellent tuition.

Thanks to John Dempsey and Cyril Connor for their help in the Golf classic and to all the sellers who assist with the half time draws. ## 1919 County Final Re-enactment

The 1919 Longford Senior Final was won by Clonbroney Camlin Rovers after a replay with Killoe Young Emmets. Several of the players were involved in the War of Independence which indicated the close connection between GAA members and the Irish Revolution.

The Clonbroney team now Sean Connollys of Ballinalee were captained on the day by Sean Connolly after whom the Connolly Cup is named. He was Vice Commandant of the North Longford 1st Battalion during the War of Independence. He dies from gunshot wounds at the Battle of Selton Hill near Mohill Co. Leitrim on 11th March 1921.

The game was re-enacted in Maguire Park, Ballinalee in September 2019. Killoe played Sean Connollys and the match was refereed by Chairperson of Longford County Council Cllr. Mícheál Carrigy. Longford Pipe Band led the teams out and despite the heavy rain it was a great success. The event was organised by Longford County Council Committee in conjunction with Longford GAA and the Sean Connollys and Emmet Óg Killoe Clubs.

I greatly appreciate your work in completing the mandatory requirements necessary to carry out your role i.e. E- vetting, Safeguarding 1 and 2 and coaching courses in order for you to carry out your role.

I attended at most of these courses and want to thank the clubs and the participants for their involvement. Please ensure all participants keep a copy of these course certificates as well as the E-vetting number. All safeguarding certificates 1,2,3 are valid for a maximum of 3 years. There is an online refresher course of Safeguarding 1 available - <https://learning.gaa.ie/safeguarding> - Brendan Harpur who delivered the new Code of Conduct course which every club received a hard copy plus an email on same. A question and answer debate took place at this course and participants ideas were given in written form so as to help complete survey on code of conduct. - Child Welfare & Safeguarding Manager Gearóid Maoilmhichíl who met our Children's Officers and coaches to explain the Code of Behaviour /Code of Conduct. - Peter and Lorraine and for all their help and support in my role as Children's Officer

I have represented Longford County Board at child welfare conferences in Croke Park and Suicide Awareness workshops as well as mental health conferences and have delivered material to clubs on same. Clubs are being asked to incorporate the GAA compliance statement as their own and adapt site specific ie their club details, services and facilities to ensure all potential risks of harm are identified and on the statement.

We will be having a tutor come to speak on same to ensure we are compliant.

All mandated persons must understand the new obligations for reporting concerns and have the necessary training complete.

Social media can be used in a very powerful way for our clubs and county in organising. Use of social media by any persons in misrepresenting the ethos of GAA and Give Respect Get Respect / Code of Conduct will not be tolerated.

I wish to take this opportunity to thank all clubs on their participation in underage GAA activities and in taking part for ye all it was successful despite whether you won or lost. It is vitally important to be a good loser as it is to be a joyous winner.

I ask all new persons and present coaches to implement the Give Respect Get Respect initiative as best they can even if it means speaking about this for 5 or 10 minutes at a training session of which I have previously advised coaches

## Hurling Development Report

Into my second year as Longford Hurling Development Administrator and which has been another year of progress, development and success on the Longford hurling front; at both county and club level.

A number of highlights have been the senior county hurlers' success on the national league, the county U-15 and U-17 squads reaching two national championship finals, another Féile title for Longford Slashers, Clonguish Gaels Leinster Championship run and the participation of four clubs in underage games.

In the early part of the year the indoor schools competition at Newtownforbes Sports Hall took place between late January and early March with over twenty teams taking part in boys and girls competitions. It was great to see a good mix of schools taking part; from both traditional and new hurling areas. With Naomh Treasa, Killoe, St Marys Edgeworthstown, Scoil Mhuire, Newtownforbes and An Gaelscoil, Longfort to the fore in competitions. Schools such as Ballinalee, Lanesboro, Clondra, Kenagh, Fermoy and Granard showed great potential and could be champions in the very near future.

At Post primary level, St Mel's took part in the North Leinster competition, winning the Blitz section. Their expanding range of teams are back training and the first years will take part in their first games of the school season shortly. Thanks to all the teachers, parents and pupils who take part in and ensure the smooth running of all school hurling activities.

In February the county hurling teams were in action. The senior county team opened their league campaign v Fermanagh and ended on March 10th as league champions, defeating Sligo in an enthralling match in Connacht's Centre of Excellence, Began. Both the U-15 Hibernia squad and U-17 Celtic Challenge squads also began their training and games in February. Both made their respective finals later in the year, with the U-15's winning the inaugural Hibernia Cup v Leitrim just last month and the U-17's losing to the same opposition in the Celtic Challenge final. Both squads made great strides during the year and this bodes very well for the future of the county senior team.

At club level there was more growth and success on a number of fronts. Wolfe Tones won the Cullen Cup when they defeated Longford Slashers in the county Féile na nGael final. Longford Slashers' and Wolfe Tones' U-14 teams took part in the National Féile competition in Cork. Slashers won another title to add to last year's success while both Wolfe Tones hurling and camogie teams further enhanced their hurling credentials. Both clubs also took part in the Táin Óg U-13 and U-15 competitions. Again, Longford Slashers secured another title defeating Middletown, Armagh on the finals day in Breffni Park.

Next year will see the Táin League extend to senior level with 14 counties in the northern part of the country taking part, including Longford's three senior clubs. The new adult competition, Cu Chullainn championship, will run from July to August with finals to be played at Abbotstown, on Saturday 15th on the eve of the All-Ireland Final with the GAA President John Horgan attending and presenting the Cups.

Kenagh have made real inroads this year, taking part in the Leinster U-8's in Croke Park in April and giving an excellent account of themselves on the day. A day I'm sure the youngsters will cherish, with Wexford senior captain Matthew O'Hanlon, taking charge of one of their games. Clonguish's young hurlers have also been very active throughout 2019. They are currently taking part in the county U-12 hurling championship. Clonguish Gaels and Kenagh have also taken part, along with Wolfe Tones and Longford Slashers in a number of GoGames Blitzes for U-8's and U-11's. Beginning with joint Cavan / Longford indoor games in February and March through to a series of games between the four Longford clubs.

Children had opportunities to play hurling at every Cúl Camp in the county throughout the summer holidays and it is always a great chance to spread the hurling gospel. And there were two hurling only camps in Easter and two in the summer which were very well attended and received. Children had the chance to see the League Cup and meet Longford hurling players from the three county squads and Galway All-Ireland winner, Aiden Harte.

Clonguish Gaels took the senior county title, overcoming Longford Slashers in the county senior final on October 13th in Glennon Brothers Pearse Park. The Gaels didn't rest on their laurels going on the record to two wins in the Leinster Junior Hurling Championship before bowing out at the semi-final stage to Conahy Shamrocks of Kilkenny.

The U-16's of Longford Slashers and Wolfe Tones met on the same day, with Slashers prevailing. The U-11's hurlers played GoGames on county final day. There is great confidence that both Clonguish Gaels and Kenagh will provide increased competition to Longford Slashers and Wolfe Tones at U-14, U-16 and minor level in the coming years.

There were also a series of outdoor primary school blitzes in November and December with St Mel college TY students helping to run this new programme. This should lead nicely into the indoor school competition after Christmas and an outdoor schools competition for later in 2020.

There are many people who continue to give fantastic support to developing Longford hurling. All the club coaches and parents, teachers in the schools and mentors to the county development squads. And I don't think I will offend anyone if I give a special word of thanks to Carol Murray who has been brilliant over the year in so many ways with her endeavours with both development squads. I am not alone in appreciating Carol's endeavours, as she recently received the award of Longford Sports Volunteer for 2019 in a ceremony in Farmleigh House, organised by the Federation of Irish Sport.

The Longford Hurling Committee, Chairman Micheal Carrigy, Secretary Michael O'Rourke, provide excellent ideas and recommendations to help further the game throughout the county. The County Board and in particular, the staff at Longford GAA, have been invaluable to their assistance and backing. Peter and Lorraine in the office; Paddy, Eoin, Ciaran and Ger in games development and our new Games Development Manager, Damien.

The staff at Leinster GAA; Alan, Noel, Colm and James are always available with help and advice. As are Pat and Caoimhe at National Development and Martin Fogarty, the National Hurling Development Manager, who has kept a keen eye on developments in Longford.

I would like to mention a few people who have been great supporters of hurling; particularly in their schools who have now retired. Liam Madden at Scoil Mhuire, Newtownforbes and Colm Harte at Naomh Treasa, Killoe. Both have been very encouraging in all my dealing with their schools and I wish them very happy and fruitful retirements.

## County Health & Wellbeing Committee

Brid McGoldrick (**Chairperson**), Eamon Brennan (**Integration**), Philip Quinn (**Youth Committee**), Marie O'Reilly Keenan (**Children's Officer**) & **Health & Well Being Officer** from each Club.

The GAA Healthy Club Project was established in 2013 with the support from Healthy Ireland, the HSE, the Office for Suicide prevention and CSR partners Irish Life. Emmet Óg Killoe and Dromard received official recognition as 'Healthy Clubs' in October 2019, having contributed significantly to the health and wellbeing of their members and communities over the previous two years. 150 clubs around the country are active in the project, with another 150 currently being recruited to commence in early 2020. Their most popular activities include offering physical activities for non-playing members (walking groups, couch to 5K, Gaelic for Mothers & Others etc.); healthy eating; mental health workshops; gambling, drug and alcohol education, including becoming smoke-free clubs; ensuring their clubs are age-friendly and diverse and inclusive of persons of all needs and abilities.





# Sub Committee Reports



## Health and Wellbeing and Positive Aging: TILDA Project

Longford became the first county in Ireland to host a regional seminar that made available the real secrets of positive ageing, based on research from Trinity College Dublin.

The County's Health & Wellbeing Committee hosted a seminar on March 11th in the Longford Arms hotel by Prof Rose Anne Kenny of Trinity College, one of the country's leading authorities on positive ageing. Over 170 people attended from all walks of life.

The content of the 'How to Age Well' seminar was based on evidence obtained from Trinity College's Longitudinal Study of Ageing (TILDA) and other international research. It would turn out to be one of Eugene McGee's last public appearances, as the late great manager of the Offaly All Ireland winning team of 1982 and former editor of the Longford Leader, acted as ambassador for the event. As ever, Eugene regaled those in attendance with anecdotes from his storied life.

## Health and wellbeing and Inclusivity:

The GAA, through its new Diversity & Inclusion Officer, Ger McTavish, is developing diversity and inclusion training that will allow clubs to identify and address such needs in their clubs. The module will be developed with support from agencies such as CARA, Sport Ireland, Sport Northern Ireland, and the GAA Gender Diversity Working Group at headquarters in Croke Park. Longford GAA is one of the counties participating in this module development which is being examined by students from Trinity College, for more details visit [www.tcd.ie/tangent](http://www.tcd.ie/tangent).

## Additional projects undertaken in 2019 (Emmet ÓG) included:

Cardiac Assessment- Cardiac Company came to club house; people signed up online and get a full cardiology consult.

Hands for Life training from the Irish Heart Foundation- Free CPR and defibrillator lessons for the club. 29 trained up locally.

Mental Health First Aider Training- 3 hour free HSE approved training was provided with participants from a number of clubs.

Critical Incident Policy prepared with template available for any clubs if required.

## Child Participation:

A lot of Research shows a child just needs "One Good Adult" in their lives. Who made a difference to your childhood? Who didn't? Why not? Who do you want to be like?

Participation in sport is paramount to their health and wellbeing. A Number of videos were developed as part of the healthy club project (Emmet Óg). The Children's video is well worth a watch and can be found on <https://youtu.be/fonhKHzzycs>. This video aims to encourage participation and positive role modelling for children. It encourages a 10 minute rule for all children up to under 12 and is based on All Blacks "Let kids be Kids video project '.

# Sub Committee Reports



## Fixtures Analyst Report

A big thank you to Damien Sheridan who coordinated a review of Underage Competitions through surveys which received a huge amount of replies but importantly gave us much information for thought going forward. This was presented to the underage sections of clubs recently but this meeting seemed to focus on the merits or otherwise of even age grades V odd age grades. In recent weeks a policy document has issued from Croke Park moving the main competition grades to the odd ages with counties given an opportunity to make application to play competition(s) at the even age grade. Many counties have sought this direction over the past 12 months including our underage sections at a review held in St. Mel's College late last year. Those persons who commit tirelessly to underage in each and every club in our county need to express their views on this issue to their Club representative on the County Committee.

Given the change to odd age grades, we now have a huge opportunity to provide more / quality games to our youth through the enlargement of the Cross-Border competition with Leitrim, something which is sought in the Review Report. I also believe than an U19 competition early in the year would give continuity to the crossover from underage to adult. Perhaps, also consideration should be given to moving the U20 to U19 and continuing to play it in the backend of the year where it would have a part in constructing an inter-county U20 panel for the following year.

Nothing has changed in 2019 when compared with my report of 2018 in which I stated the following: "From the table below it is quite obvious that a revamp of both Division 3 and the Reserve Leagues is required given that 20%+ of the games in each of these competitions are not being played. Given that the majority of clubs have not got a second separate team should we consider getting rid of the Reserve leagues to be replaced by a version of the "Monaghan" league? If this were adopted this would give more certainty to when league fixtures are played especially during the intercounty championship door." Something needs to be done urgently if we are to stop the drop off at adult level as well.

## 1. STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE

These financial statements have been prepared in compliance with FRS 102 Section 1A, 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland'.

## 2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

### BASIS OF PREPARATION

The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis, under the historical cost basis. Historical cost is generally based on the fair value of the consideration given in exchange for assets. The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items that are considered material to the financial statements of C.L.G. Coiste Chontae Longfoirt.

The financial statements are prepared in Euro, which is the functional currency of the entity.

### TANGIBLE ASSETS

Tangible fixed assets are initially recorded at cost, and are subsequently stated at cost less any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

Any tangible fixed assets carried at revalued amounts are recorded at the fair value at the date of revaluation less any subsequent accumulated depreciation and subsequent accumulated impairment losses.

### DEPRECIATION

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost or valuation of an asset, less its residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

If there is an indication that there has been a significant change in depreciation rate, useful life or residual value of tangible assets, the depreciation is revised prospectively to reflect the new estimates.

### IMPAIRMENT

A review for indicators of impairment is carried out at each reporting date, with the recoverable amount being estimated where such indicators exist. Where the carrying value exceeds the recoverable amount, the asset is impaired accordingly. Prior impairments are also reviewed for possible reversal at each reporting date.

### GRANTS

Grants towards capital expenditure are released to the income and expenditure account over the expected useful life of the assets. Grants towards revenue expenditure are released to the income and expenditure account as the related expenditure is incurred.

### INVESTMENTS

Croke Park 10 year tickets are released to the income and expenditure account over 10 years.

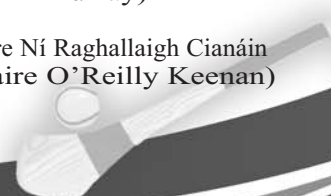

## MOTION 1

Amend **Rule 6.12 (b) (ii) 2019 Official Guide Part 1** (Pages 81 & 82) by way of *insertion of the following* under **Exception**

### 6.12 **Playing in U.S.A./Canada/Australasia/Europe**

**(a)** A week-end Authorisation is required by any player intending to assist a Club in a game under the jurisdiction of the New York Board or the European Board. The Official Authorisation, in duplicate, requires the signatures of the player's Home Club Secretary and the County Secretary, and must be presented for signature by the Director General (or other designated person) in Croke Park before 4 p.m. on the Wednesday before the game.

An Authorisation is valid for one week-end only other than where there is a replay of the game for which the Authorisation was granted.

The maximum number of authorised players to assist a Club on any week-end shall be two in Football and three in Hurling.

**(b)(i)** A player intending to play on a longer-term basis in the area governed by either the New York Board or the Canadian Board - must obtain an Official Sanction in duplicate, signed by his Club Secretary, the County Secretary and the Director General (or other designated person).

**(ii)** A player intending to play on a longer-term basis in the area governed by the USGAA Board must obtain an Official Sanction or an Official J1 Sanction in duplicate, signed by his Club Secretary, the County Secretary and the Director General (or other designated person).

A player who has been included on an Inter-County Senior Championship list submitted to the Referee, in accordance with Rules of Specification 2.5 (ii)(a) for a game in the current year's Championship shall not be eligible to be accepted for Registration as a member of any Club in the USGAA Board Jurisdiction.

**Exception:** *The above shall not apply to a player on a team competing in the Tier 2 Football or Tiers 3/4/5 Hurling Championship*

and

A player who has been included on an Inter-County Senior Championship list submitted to the Referee, in accordance with Rules of Specification 2.5 (ii)(a), for a game in the current year's Championship, who holds a valid current J1 Visa or meets the eligibility requirements to obtain a J1 Visa, and who obtains an Official J1 Sanction in duplicate, signed by his Club Secretary, the County Secretary and the Director General (or other designated person), may be accepted for registration. Such a player may only have his J1 Sanction approved once his team has been eliminated from the Inter-County Championship including All-Ireland Qualifier games.

The J1 Visa concerned with this Exception is the J1 Work and Travel Programme Visa only – i.e. the four-month Visa for 3rd Level Students.

*A member other than the County Referees Administrator and the full time County Secretary who has served for more than three years shall be ineligible for a period of one year to be reappointed to the County Competitions Control Committee.*

*For the avoidance of doubt, if a member other than the County Referees Administrator and the full time County Secretary has served of this committee in 2020, 2021 and 2022 they are ineligible to be appointed to this committee for 2023.*

**These Bye-Laws shall be read in conjunction**

**with the current Treoir Oifigiúil.**

**All Rule Numbers Quoted are as per T.O. 2019**

#### **1. COUNTY CONVENTION (Rules 3.10 to 3.17 T.O. 2019)**

1.01 County Convention, convened in accordance with Rule 3.10, shall having firstly been duly nominated in accordance with Rule 3.13 elect/appoint the following:

- Officers and Representatives in accordance with Rule 3.11:

Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson, Secretary, **Assistant Secretary (if desired)**, Treasurer, Assistant-Treasurer, Coaching Officer, Officer for Irish Language and Culture and Public Relations Officer and shall appoint a Development Officer and a Children's Officer as recommended by the outgoing County Committee.

It shall further elect Two representatives on Provincial Council and One representative on Central Council.

- Delegates to Annual Congress and Provincial Convention in accordance with Rule 3.12

- 1.02 A person nominated for any of the above elected positions shall, by a date notified by the County Secretary, confirm in writing their willingness or otherwise to seek or not seek election.
- 1.03 Rule 3.11 (b) T.O. 2019 shall not apply to the position of Children's Officer.
- 1.04 Before publication of Convention motions submitted in accordance with Rule 3.14, they shall be examined by An Coiste Bainistíochta & Airgeadais and motions considered out of order should be returned to the submitting Unit indicating the reason(s) and affording an opportunity to re-submit.
- 1.05 A full-time Secretary appointed for a period in excess of one year shall not have voting rights and is not subject to re-election (Rule 3.11 (b) Exception (1) T.O. 2019).

## 2. COUNTY COMMITTEE (Rules 3.18 to 3.19 T.O. 2019)

In accordance with Rule 3.18 (a) T.O. 2019, the County Committee shall consist of the County Secretary (without voting rights if Full Time), the Officers elected/appointed pursuant to Rule 3.11, the Two Leinster Council representatives and the One Central Council representative (elected pursuant to Bye Law 1 above and who shall be ex-officio members), the County Referees' Administrator, one named representative of each of the following Sub Committees: Youth, Hurling, County Primary Schools, County Post Primary Schools and two ~~one~~ representatives from each affiliated club as follows:

one named representative with voting rights who shall represent the adult section and who may appoint a person to deputise to attend and vote at meetings of the County Committee,

one named representative with voting rights who shall represent the underage section and whom shall not appoint a person to deputise to attend and vote at meetings of the County Committee This representative shall, if reappointed by his/her Club, hold this position for a maximum of three (3) years.

## 3. SUB COMMITTEES (Rules 3.20 to 3.21 T.O. 2019)

In accordance with Rule 3.20 and subject to Rules 3.21 and 4.2 T.O. 2019, the County Committee shall appoint the following Sub Committees, membership of which shall be determined as follows:

- 3.01 **Management Committee:** It shall consist of the County Secretary (without voting rights if Full time) together with the Officers/Representatives elected/appointed pursuant to Bye Law 1.01 above.

**Quorum 4 Members**

- 3.02 **County Competitions Control Committee:** It shall consist of a named Chairperson, the County Secretary (without voting rights if Full time) or a named replacement who shall act as its secretary, ~~County Referees' Administrator (who shall vote only on the appointment of referees)~~, 2 named members of the Management Committee and 5 other named Members of the County Committee or other suitable personnel (e.g. Youth and Hurling Committees, Clubs participating in the Senior Football Championship and Clubs participating in the Intermediate / Junior Football Championship). Members, with the exception of the Full Time County Secretary and the Referees' Administrator, shall be nominated by the Management Committee for appointment by County Committee.

This Committee shall have plenary powers.

- 3.06 **County Referees' Administration Committee:** It shall consist of the County Referees' Administrator, one Member of the Management Committee and 3 other named members (one of whom shall act as Rúnaí) nominated by the Management Committee for appointment by the County Committee.

- 3.07 **County Coaching & Games Development Committee:** It shall consist of the County Coaching Officer as Chairperson, Games Development Manager (who shall act as Secretary) and one named representative from each of the following Committees; Youth, Hurling, Primary Schools and Post Primary Schools and 3 other named members nominated by the Management Committee for appointment by County Committee.

**Quorum 3 Members**

- 3.08 **County Cultural Committee:** It shall consist of the Officer for Irish Language & Culture and 4 other named members (one of whom shall act as Rúnaí) nominated by the Management Committee for appointment by County Committee.

**Quorum 3 Members**

- 3.09 **County Public Relations/Marketing Committee:** It shall consist of the County Public Relations Officer and 4 other named members (one of whom shall act as Rúnaí) nominated by the Management Committee for appointment by County Committee.

**Quorum 3 Members**

- 3.10 **County Youth Committee:** It shall consist of a Chairperson, Vice Chairperson and Secretary nominated by the Management Committee for appointment by County Committee plus two named representatives from each underage section of Clubs that are affiliated to compete in an underage championship in the current year, one of whom only shall have voting rights.

**Quorum 8 Members**

- 3.11 **County Finance Sub Committee:** It shall consist of the Cathaoirleach of Coiste Chontae, Rúnaí Chontae (without voting rights if Full Time), Cisteoir and Leas Cisteoir and 4 other named members nominated by the Management Committee for appointment by County Committee.

**Quorum 3 Members**





- 3.12 **County Information Technology Committee:** It shall consist of the County Public Relations Officer and 4 other named members (one of whom shall act as Secretary), nominated by the Management Committee for appointment by County Committee.

**Quorum 3 Members**

- 3.13 **County Teams' Management & Panels' Committee:** The membership of the County Teams' Management and Panels' Committee shall be as outlined in the Charter for County Committee/Player Relationships and as approved/changed from time to time by Central Council. The named membership shall be nominated by the Management Committee for appointment by County Committee.

**Quorum 3 Members**

- 3.14 **County Health & Wellbeing Committee:** It shall consist of the County Health & Wellbeing Officer (whom shall be nominated for appointment by the Management Committee), the County Children's Officer, a Member of the Management Committee and the Health & Well Being Officer of each Club. The administration and responsibilities of this subcommittee shall be as laid down by the Management Committee, Croke Park and as amended by them from time to time.

**Quorum 4 Members**

*In accordance with Rule 3.19 (l) T.O. 2019 Coiste Chontae shall appoint the following subcommittees whose powers and functions shall be as detailed in these Bye-Laws:*

- 3.15 **Hurling Committee:** It shall consist of a Chairperson, Secretary, (both of whom shall be nominated by the Management Committee for appointment by County Committee), 1 Member of the Management Committee plus two named representatives of each affiliated Club having a Hurling team which participates in an adult Hurling Championship. Subject to the overall control of the County Committee it shall be responsible for all matters appertaining to Hurling in the County with the exception of Fixtures and Discipline which shall be dealt with by the County Competitions Control Committee.

**Quorum 3 Members**

- 3.16 **County Primary Schools Committee:** It shall consist of the following:

- a) A named representative of each affiliated Primary Level School in the County
- b) A Member of the Management Committee who may act as the Committee Chairperson
- c) A named representative of the County Coaching and Games Development Committee

The Members of this Committee shall also act as Primary Schools Competitions Control Committee and any Hearings or Appeals as requested or proscribed shall be made to the County Hearings Committee.

## 4. ATTACHMENT TO FIRST CLUB

- 4.01 In accordance with Rules 6.4(b) & (c) T.O. 2019, a Youth Member shall only be entitled to join, and play for a Club within the catchment area of his/her permanent residence or a Club with which in accordance with Rule 6.3 T.O. 2019 he/she is deemed to have Other Relevant Connections as follows:
- a) the club within the catchment area in which he/she went to Primary School and with whom he/she first played football or hurling in an official Schools' competition
  - b) the Club within the catchment area of his/her parent's native Parish
- 4.02 Catchment Areas shall be determined by the County Committees as per Rule 6.3 T.O. 2019

## 5. PERMANENT RESIDENCE

Permanent Residence for the purposes of these Bye-Laws shall be the address at which the players/members family permanently resides. In the case of a dispute as to the permanent residence of a player/member, the County Competitions Control Committee shall require the player/member to submit such documentary evidence as is considered necessary to satisfy the bona-fides of same. Any party aggrieved at the decision may appeal in writing to the County Hearings Committee, within three days of the receipt of notification of the decision.

## 6. INTER CLUB TRANSFERS

### 6.01 Adult Transfers

Members over the age of 18 years may apply for a transfer to leave one Club and join another Club.

### 6.02 Underage Transfers

- a) No player under 18 years shall be granted a transfer unless it is shown that the player has moved permanent residence to the catchment area of the Club to which the transfer is sought.
- b) Participation in Go Games ~~at Under 8 and Under 10 levels~~ as defined in the Official Guide shall not be regarded as official competition for the purposes of the attachment of a player to their First Club as defined in Rule 6.4 T.O. 2019.

6.03 Transfers within the County shall be dealt with in accordance with Rule 6.5 T.O. 2019 and these Bye-Laws.

### 6.04 Application for Transfer

Applications for transfers within the County shall be made on the prescribed form and signed by the player seeking the transfer (with the approval of both Clubs being optional) and shall be lodged with the Secretary of the County Committee on or before a date duly notified to Clubs each year but no later than the last day of February.

6.05 The County Competitions Control Committee (CCCC), when adjudicating and making its decision on a Transfer Application shall, in addition to the requirements of Rule 6.5 T.O. 2019:

- (a) Be cognisant of the role played by his current Club, in nurturing and developing the individual Player.
- (b) Be cognisant of the Association's Ethos as recited in Rule 6.1 T.O. 2019
- (c) Be cognisant of the potential impact of a decision to grant the application on his current Club
- (d) Be cognisant of any observations/submissions put forward by the Member in support of his application.



## Exception

An application for a transfer may be considered and granted in exceptional circumstances where a case involving a member is on file with both the County Designated Liaison Officer and the GAA National Child Welfare Manager.

Such application shall only proceed following consultations with the County Designated Liaison Officer and the GAA National Child Welfare Manager.

- 6.06 The decision of CCCC on the transfer application shall be notified by the Secretary CCCC as soon as is practicable to the player (if he has supplied a contact email with his application) and both Club Secretaries.

## 7. AFFILIATIONS

The entry fee for Championships shall be determined annually by the County Committee on a recommendation by the Management Committee.

## 8. AMALGAMATIONS / INDEPENDENT TEAMS (at Underage Level)

The Youth Committee may recommend that players of Clubs unable to field an underage team(s) may play on an amalgamated/independent underage team(s) of no more than two clubs in some or all competitions in both Championship and/or league. Approval for such arrangements must be sought from the County Committee in advance of draws taking place for competitions.

## 9. GRADING OF CLUBS AND PLAYERS

- 9.01 A team winning the Junior Football Championship may opt to  
(a) remain in Junior Grade for the following year

OR

- (b) be promoted to Intermediate Grade in the following year.

In the event of a team winning the Junior Football Championship in two successive years it shall be promoted to Intermediate Grade automatically.

- 9.02 A team winning the Intermediate Football Championship shall may opt to  
~~a) Remain in the Intermediate grade for the following year~~

OR

- ~~b) Be promoted to Senior Grade in the following year.~~

~~In the event of a team winning the Intermediate Football Championship in two successive years it shall be promoted to Senior Grade automatically.~~

- 9.03 For a club with a Senior and Intermediate team Coiste Chontae may regrade a maximum of 6 players from Senior grade to Intermediate grade.

- 9.04 For a club with a Senior and Junior team Coiste Chontae may regrade a maximum of 3 players from Senior to Junior.

- 9.05 For a club with an Intermediate and Junior team Coiste Chontae may regrade a maximum of 6 players from Intermediate to Junior.

- 9.06 The winners of the Intermediate and Junior Championships shall be allowed to regrade 5 players from their Championship winning teams.

## 10. Deviations

Applications made under R. 3.19 (n) T.O. 2019 to avail of a provision of Rule 6.8 Exception (1) (a) or (b) shall be submitted for approval no later than 30th April each year.

The following statements are not Convention business and will be referred to a meeting of Coiste Chontae:

That the Regulation that determines “Winner on the Day” in accordance with **Rule 3.6 (a) 2019 Official Guide Part 2** be amended as follows:

If after extra time as provided for in Rule has been played the game finishes level, then a further period of extra time of 5 minutes a half shall be played. If this ends level it should go to “Golden Score”.

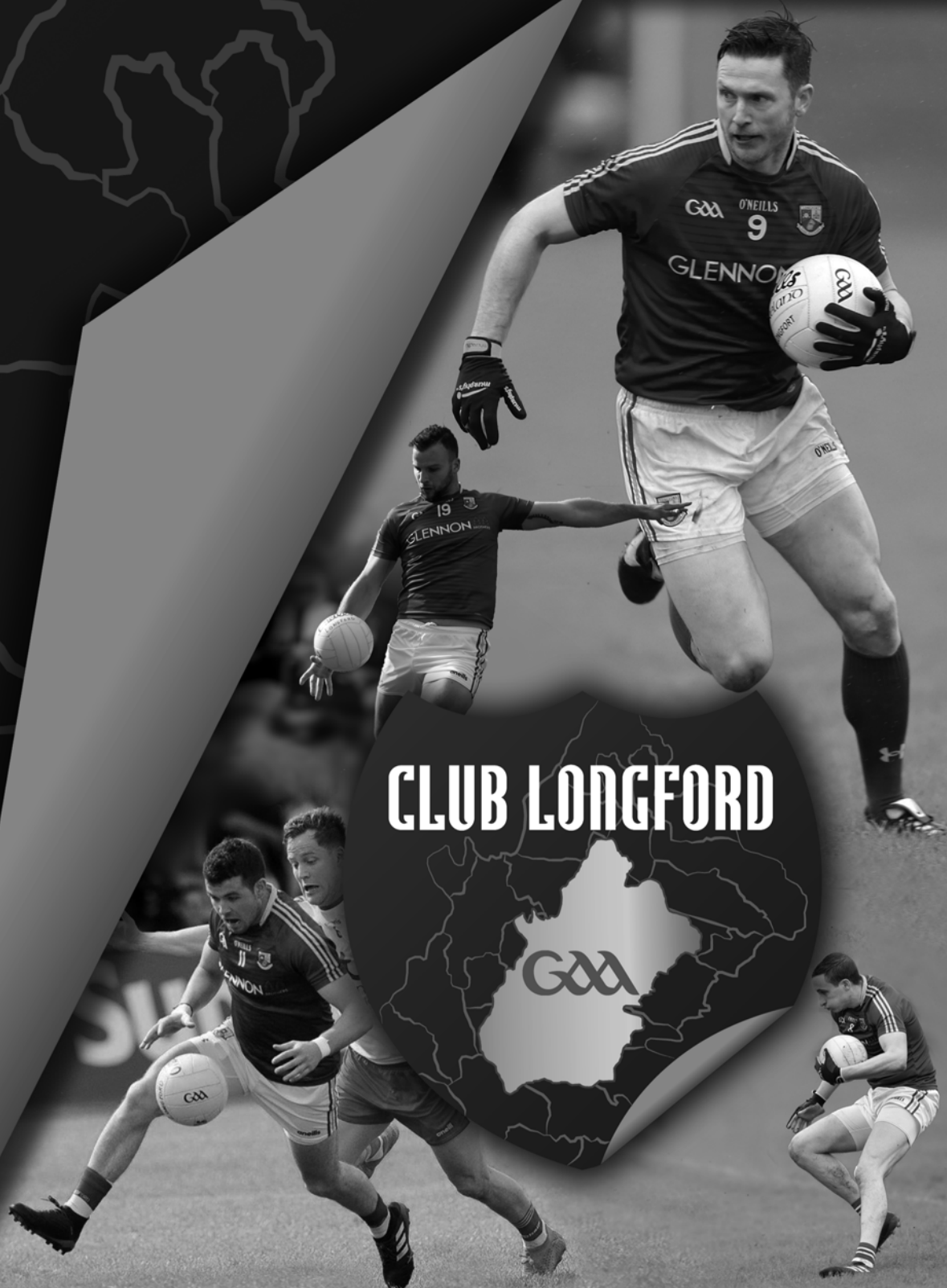
